

Emergency Shelter One Night Census Count - November 15, 2010

Each year, the Vermont Office of Economic Opportunity conducts a survey of Vermont's homeless shelters and services providers. Known as the one-night shelter count, the survey gauges shelter utilization and provides a snapshot of people who are homeless on that evening. Data are reported by shelters, transitional living programs and homelessness prevention or essential services programs receiving Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funding.

Emergency Shelter

On November 15, 2010, there were **382** persons staying in ESG-funded homeless shelters.
